It is rare to hear about duty in our society now, except when we come to Remembrance Day, at the 11th hour of the 11th day of November. Sacrifice and duty were wrapped up in the fabric of the nation. The words "We will remember them" are spoken every year at services of remembrance in cities, towns and villages everywhere.

Every village has a memorial. How do we remember them?

Hopefully through working to improve communities around us and around the world.

Rotary have recently planted over 300 crocuses in the Community Garden, South Road, as a symbol of their 35 year fight to eradicate Polio. Polio was rife in Britain in living memory. It is a hideous disease. Since the first vaccination program in the Philippines, in 1979, Rotarians have raised £1.5 Billion and badgered/ persuaded governments to invest £7.5 Billion more. They have reduced Polio cases by over 99%, which is extraordinary. They keep going, because if all efforts stopped today, within 10 years, Polio could paralyse as many as 200,000 children each year.

Meldrum Parish Church has supported Blytheswood Care, for decades, by filling shoe boxes every year, to send to Eastern European countries, including Ukraine. Each box is filled with essentials and gifts, for particular age groups, including adults, to spread kindness at Christmas.

Meldrum Amenities Improvement Group (MAIG) have brightened up Oldmeldrum for the past decade, bringing colourful splendour to our streets & square and most recently winning a Gold Medal, in the Keep Scotland Beautiful competition.

All while you can advertise your group or organisation.





#### A MELDRUM HERO OF THE GREAT WAR

The Distinguished Conduct Medal was, for other ranks in World War I, second only to the Victoria Cross as a reward for gallantry in action. Among several Oldmeldrum men awarded the DCM was Serjeant John Duff. He told the writer about some of his experiences as a soldier in the Great War and as a railwayman in peacetime when we met at his home at 21 Albert Place in March 1977. Such was John's modesty that he didn't reveal to me that he had been awarded the DCM which I learned of only recently.

John's parents lived in King Street, Oldmeldrum, when he enlisted with the 1/6th (Banff and Donside) Battalion, Gordon Highlanders, on October 14, 1915. The battalion was kept in reserve on July 1, 1916, the catastrophic first day of the Battle of the Somme, being in trenches east of Neuville St Vaast. In the first week of August, the 6th Gordons were helping to hold High Wood along with two other battalions. John remembered the terrible carnage of the Somme battle and having to clamber over bodies which clogged up communication trenches. He recalled an incident in which he was buried alive following a shell blast. It was not until many years later that he learned of his rescuer's identity, who was Alexander Ramsay, gamekeeper of the Barra Castle Estate, near Oldmeldrum. He called on John to apologise for "chipping" his shoulder with a spade. The accompanying illustration is of a Gordon Highlander, entitled Jock – K1, by Snaffles (Charles Payne).



John, who was now a lance-corporal, transferred to the 1/14th London Regiment (London Scottish) on March 22, 1918. He was wounded that year when an enemy bullet tore away three ribs and embedded itself in his vertebrae. A surgeon was reluctant to remove the bullet for fear that he might damage John's spinal cord. A less cautious South African surgeon swiftly removed the bullet which was then pinned to John's chest. The citation for John's DCM, which was announced in the London Gazette on December 5, 1918, read: "For conspicuous gallantry during an attack. He led the leading platoon with great dash and captured twenty

conspicuous gallantry during an attack. He led the leading platoon with great dash and captured twenty prisoners and a number of machine-guns at the first objective. He then went on and in face of very heavy fire took the second objective, maintaining his position for several hours until the platoons on the flanks came to his assistance. By holding on where he did, he was mainly responsible for the capture of eighty prisoners and ten machine-guns. His courage and leadership were admirable."

After the war, John worked as a train guard for the Great North of Scotland Railway and its successor, the London and North Eastern Railway. He had survived being wounded several times during the war but was destined to be injured while working on the railway.

During the national coal strike of 1921, coal for steam locomotives was in short supply and at Ballater they resorted to sawing up old sleepers for fuel. While assisting in the loading of a locomotive tender, John was struck on the head by a falling sleeper which split his head open and broke his neck. He spent the next 11 months in hospital recovering from his injuries. After John returned to work, the railway company was not prepared to compensate him for industrial injuries. Despite this treatment, John worked for 43 years on the railways.




